Miramar	Add additional transmission and distribution piping and expand the City's reclaimed water distribution system.	\$4,000,000
Oakland Park	Project seeks to alleviate flooding and prevent further repetitive losses to properties thus increasing the health and safety in the area	\$500,000
Pembroke Pines	To create an alternative water supply by treating and reusing all wastewater generated at the existing wastewater treatment facility.	\$33,525,000
Plantation	Replacement and rehabilitation of aging water main infrastructure of 45-50 years old in Plantation Park, Phase F.	2,500,000
Riviera Beach	To improve the severe erosion north of the Palm Beach County Ocean Reef Park to the north end of Singer Island.	\$6,000,000
Riviera Beach	To improve the function of Lift Station #50 and allow for proper operation (especially during storm events).	\$1,000,000
